ANNUAL REPORT 2018

Z-Net Project: This ambitious Shire-wide project, funded by the State government, was launched by Hepburn Wind and Hepburn Shire in April. The project aims to transition our communities to zero-net carbon emissions through development of a Community Transition Plan. As a first step, almost 1,000 residents took part in the household energy survey, followed by workshops and information sessions held in Trentham and other towns in Hepburn Shire. It is an exciting opportunity to meet and work with experts in the field who provide a wealth of knowledge to our local communities, as the program continues.

Solar Bulk Buy: is well on track to meet the Z-net goal with 135 solar and battery systems ordered so far. This will cut CO2 emissions by 1,200 tonnes annually once installed. For more information about the Hepburn Solar Bulk-Buy visit www.mash.org.au/hepburn or call 1300 466 274.

Produce Exchange: The January food swap will mark the 5th anniversary of successful monthly swaps, held on 3rd Saturday each month at Trentham Farmers Market. Trentham Food Hub: "Transitioning our community towards a thriving local food economy". Another successful year as the Food Hub team continues renovating our distribution centre (the Shed), located up the drive beside The Plough.
